### FINT 2016 Workshop in Dublin: Bangin' the Bodhrán of Trust Research

The 9th FINT Workshop on "Trust Within and Between Organizations" kicked off in Dublin on 16 November 2016 at the Royal College of Surgeons. Following the JTR Doctoral Student and Junior Faculty Colloquium, FINTers took part in the Opening Ceremony and Welcome Reception. The next morning, FINT President Antoinette Weibel pointed out to the 125 attendees from around the world that trust's importance and topicality held both **an opportunity and an obligation** for trust researchers. After the first keynote by Paul Zak on the Neuroscience of Organizational Trust, FINTers enjoyed lots of inspiring paper sessions and coffee break conversations. Later, over at the Royal College of Physicians, the classy Conference Dinner turned into a bodhrán-banging bedlam after Antoinette Weibel thanked the local organizers, awarded the honorary title of "Fellow of FINT" to Don Ferrin, Richard Priem and Denise Skinner, and announced **St. Gallen University as the next FINT venue**.
