Entrepreneurs' distrust - A stakeholder approach in technology parks

Prof. Ann-Marie Nienaber (Coventry University, UK) and her research team have finished their British Council Newton Fund Institutional Links funded project. For two years they have been investigating entrepreneurs' relationships within two technology parks, a British and a Turkish one. The research team has now summarized the findings and created a comprehensive business report that not only allows insights into the research but also presents a large section with practical examples for technology park managers, entrepreneurs, supporting agencies and academics how to diminish distrust and to foster trust in technology parks.
